### **Elementary Fees**

Book rent: \$50.00 per student (\$37.50 for reduced) Breakfast: \$1.50 a day (\$0.30 reduced) Lunch: \$2.30 (reduced \$0.40) Semester milk for preschool: \$30.60 Semester milk for kindergarten: \$40.50
You may send book rent or lunch fees at any time to the elementary office. If you want to apply for free or reduced lunches, you may do so at any time of the school year, we have those forms in the office. We also have the option to pay lunches online, however; there is a \$2.00 charge for this transaction. Lunch notices will be sent home via email or if we do not have your email address a paper copy will be sent home with your student once they have \$10.00 or less in the family account. Sloan town bus transportation fees for your child(ren) if you choose to use our bus service is as follows: full year both ways: \$100.00, one way full year: \$50.00; reduced fee (per your lunch application) both ways full year: \$74.00, one way full year: \$37.00; free lunch status fee (per your lunch application) both ways full year: \$50.00, one way full year: \$25.00

#### A few reminders:

If you are picking your child up early from school or at bus time we ask that you check into the office and either wait in the office or the commons for your child. Classes are still in session until dismissal; your child's teacher will send them to the office to be picked up. This also helps us if a bus driver calls in looking for a student, we can let the bus driver know if they were picked up early by a parent and not still in the building thus holding up our bus departures.

Due to federal funding for our lunch program, please do not bring in any "fast food" lunches or soft drinks in competition with our school lunches.

If your child is ill or has an appointment, please call the office and let them know. The office will email the teacher and let him/her know where your child is today. If you have an appointment please ask for a "school excuse" to be turned into the office once your child returns. This will be coded in for the State of lowa for your child's attendance.

### Box Tops, Pop Can Pull Tabs & Hy-Vee Receipts

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#### Dear Parents:

In order to continue to improve the health and safety of our students, our Safe Routes to School coalition is going to be holding another **Westwood Walks** day. Our first one day event was held last spring. All students in grades PK – 6th are encouraged to walk or bike to school on October 5th. Those that are bussed will have the opportunity to also participate. The busses will be dropping students off at Eastview Drive and N Shannon Drive. Adult volunteers and high school students will be assisting students south on Eastview Drive to the sidewalk on the Northside of the school property and then to the North playground. All students who walk or bike to school should meet on the North playgroup. A Go Breakfast will be provided upon arrival.

If your child(ren) would like to participate in Westwood Walks, please complete the enrollment and consent form, and return it the office by September 21.

For the safety of the students and the volunteers, the students must abide by the following expectations:

- 1. There will be volunteers leading the walk and there will be volunteers at the end of the line. Students much stay between volunteers.
- 2. No running is permitted.
- 3. Students must be aware of traffic at drive-ways, intersections and other thoroughfares. Volunteers will be there to assist students across the intersections.
- 4. Students must be respectful of other students, volunteers, the neighborhood and neighbors.
- 5. Students must follow the expectations. If they don't they will be given one verbal warning and if the behavior persists they will have to go to the office upon arrival to the school.

Your child(ren)'s participation in Westwood Walks is completely voluntary, free, and you are not required to volunteer. If you are interested in volunteering, please indicate your interest on the enrollment and consent form. **VOLUNTEERS ARE ESSENTIAL** for safety and program success!
